Job Description:

Summer Art Camp Group Leaders are integral to the fun and function of the Summer Art Camp program. Group Leaders support instructors by providing direct supervision of campers throughout the day while gaining valuable experience in education, child development, and arts programming.

Primary Job Responsibilities:

- Assist with the instruction, supervision, and care of campers while in classroom activities under the direction of the camp Instructors.
- Lead campers in supervised activities during morning drop-off times.
- Provide supervision and care for campers during transitions between activities, bathroom breaks, and during lunch and recess.
- Address campers' physical, emotional, and social well-being needs as they arise.
- Follow and implement the Camp Agreements (rules and guidelines) and provide positive behavioral support to campers when necessary.
- Collaborate effectively with the Education Director and Camp Coordinator for daily camp operations and communicate any camper/staff needs and concerns.
- Adhere to and promote established Summer Art Camp Health and Safety Procedures at all times.
